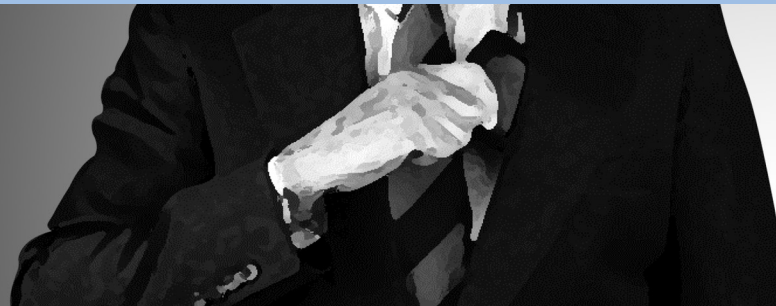


# PROVING CORRUPTION IN INTERNATIONAL ARBITRATION
